ENTRY CHECK LIST

Before mailing your entries, please make sure that the following information has been included.

- A completed entry form, including full names and registration numbers of horses entered. Signatures of owner, riders, handlers, coach, trainer and consent for junior exhibitor if appropriate.
- Copy of each horse's registration papers with pedigree.
- Copies of your current AHA and USEF Competition cards. Owner, rider/handler all must be a current member of AHA to show at the Regional level. If you are not a current member of USEF, there will be a \$45.00 fee per person (all ages).
- A \$15.00 fee per horse entered for Resolution 9-90. This fee is mandatory and must be included.
- A check made payable to Working Western Celebration for all fees included on the entry form
- There will be a \$40.00 charge per check for any returned checks.

The Alliant Energy Center is located at the gateway to downtown Madison, WI, just off the Beltline (Hwy 12 & 18), on John Nolen Drive. With such a great location, the campus is just five minutes from interstate 90/94 via Hwy 12 & 18, minutes from the Wisconsin State Capitol, Madison's State Street area and the University of Wisconsin-Madison campus, and only 15 minutes from the Dane County Regional Airport, which travels non-stop to and from many key destinations, or to and from from anywhere in the world through connecting hubs.

SHOW INFORMATION

STABLING INFORMATION

10' x 10' portable metal stalls with 4' solid poly bottoms and vertical bar tops, doors are provided.. A limited number of stallion upper panels are available.

STALL DECORATIONS

Stall decorations shall be made of non-flammable or treated material and maintained in flame retardant condition.

TRAILER PARKING AREAS

As soon as horses are unloaded vehicles must be moved to designated parking areas. **No parking in barn aisles.**

CLASS CALLS

Due to unforeseeable problems with any mechanical devices, the PA system and paddock calls must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that his horse is at the gate at the prescribed time. Every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system to carry class calls; however, no protest will be upheld, nor will any class be changed on the basis of PA malfunction alone.

REFUNDS

Horses may be scratched from the show at the owner's option. Refunds of entry fees will be considered for any horse suffering from illness or injury upon the presentation of a veterinarian's certificate accompanied with a letter explaining the circumstances to the Show Secretary PRIOR to the start of said show. Requests for any refunds due to the illness or injury of the exhibitor and accompanied with a letter from the doctor will be considered and will be subject to Management's decision if they are received PRIOR to the start of said show. **ALL REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING ACCOMPANIED BY A VETERINARIANS CERTIFICATE OR DOCTORS LETTER AND MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE SHOW SECRETARY PRIOR TO THE START OF THE SAID SHOW.** On approved refund requests ONLY class fees will be refunded. NO refunds will be made on stall/tack/groom rooms drug fees resolution fees office fees or any other fees. All refunds granted will be made by mail in approximately 2 weeks after the show. Substitution of horses will be permitted as stated in USEF GR911.

CANCELLATION OF ENTRY

To encourage early entries the Management agrees to cancel and refund entry stall and all fees on any horse not fit to show providing written or email notification nharvey440@aol.com is given to the Show Secretary on or before entry closing date - 8/31/18.

SCRATCHING OR CANCELING CLASSES - As a COURTESY to the GATEMAN AND ANNOUNCER and SHOW OFFICE exhibitors are requested to notify the GATEMAN and SHOW OFFICE when it is necessary to scratch or cancel a class entered. This courtesy will enable the Show to run more efficiently. Your consideration will be greatly appreciated.

Regional Awards are the same as presented during regular Regional Championship classes in respective home regions.

GENERAL INFORMATION

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF AMATEUR CERTIFICATION FOR EC AMATEUR MEMBERS - EC amateur members, competing in amateur classes, must complete and sign a USEF membership application verifying they meet USEF amateur requirements. There is no charge.

USEF MEMBERSHIP - Affidavits are no longer accepted for payment of non-member fees. Exhibitors must have a Competing Membership, either Life, Senior Active or Junior Active Member or pay a Show Pass Fee. See next paragraph.

USEF NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION - If membership documentation is not submitted to the competition and the competition cannot verify such information, the exhibitor will be required to complete a Show Pass form and pay a non-refundable Show Pass fee of \$45.00. (GR1309.2.b) Purchase of a Show Pass fee does NOT allow a competitor to show in amateur classes. To show in an amateur class, a competitor must provide proof of membership with amateur certification.

AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS – Copies of ALL trainer's, driver's, rider's and Breeding/Halter handler's and at least ONE Owner's current AHA COMPETITION Membership Cards MUST be included with the horse show entry form at the time of entry. Any owner trainer driver rider breeding/halter handler who exhibits horses in the show ring or signs the entry form as the responsible person for any individual's horses at the show must be a current competition member of A.H.A. at the time of entry and at the time of showing. An AHA Single Event Membership Fee of \$40.00 must be paid ONE TIME ONLY for both shows if not a current competition member of AHA or you do not have a current competition card. Membership Affidavits are no longer available.

GENERAL INFORMATION

USEF MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS - Copies of every owner's, trainer's, rider's, driver's and breeding/In-hand halter handler's current USEF Membership Cards MUST be included with the horse show entry form at the time of entry. If showing in Amateur classes, the card must have Amateur Certification included. If you do not have a copy of your current USEF membership card, you will have to pay \$45.00 non refundable non member fee. If you are NOT a member of USEF, you MUST pay the appropriate non-member fee. Affidavits are no longer available. USEF Membership for an adult is \$80 (with or without amateur certification). USEF Membership for junior is \$80.00

AMATEUR OWNER FAMILY DEFINITION - An Amateur Owner Class is one in which every contestant is an Amateur and the rider driver or handler is the Owner or an Amateur Member of the owner's family. "Family" includes husband wife parent stepparent child brother stepchild sister half-brother and sister aunt uncle niece nephew grandmother grandfather and in-laws of the same relation as stated. Combined ownership is NOT permitted in Amateur/Owner classes unless all owners are members of the same family. LEASED horses are NOT eligible. (See USEF GR136)

ARENA DIMENSIONS & FOOTING – Show ring is 85' x 215' with a 14' single entry door. The Arena has a combination bleacher and chair seating for up to 550 people. Footing is a mixture of native soil and washed sand.

CRUELTY AND ABUSE - USEF GR839 AR105 AND AHA ARTICLE 304.6 WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED AT ALL AHA RECOGNIZED COMPETITIONS.

DISCIPLINE - Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy to the officials of this show on the part of the owner lessee trainer groom rider or driver will disqualify the horse from adjudication. The management reserves the right to remove a horse owner lessee trainer groom or rider from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.

FARRIER AND VETERINARIAN

The farrier will be on the grounds throughout the show. The on-call Veterinarian is Univ of Wisc Vet School (608) 263-7600. (Posted in Show Office)

GATE RULE - Due to a full schedule of classes the TWO-MINUTE limit after last call for a class will be strictly enforced. Exhibitors are cautioned against entering the same horse in successive classes. The gate will close 2 minutes after the first horse enters the ring or in cases with large classes taking more than 2 minutes at the completion of final horse in the continuous string of horses. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EXHIBITOR TO BE SURE THAT HIS/HER HORSE IS AT THE GATE ON TIME. CLASS CALLS MUST BE CONSIDERED A COURTESY ONLY. No protests will be upheld on the basis of a public address system malfunction. "Open" cards may be run for hunter/jumper classes to assist exhibitors who might have a conflict with classes in another arena. Check with show manager or in the show office for details.

GENERAL INFORMATION

HALF ARABIAN/ANGLO ARABIAN COLTS/STALLIONS – Half Arabian and Anglo-Arabian stallions registered with AHA or which have been issued an AHA CPAR (Canadian Part-bred Arabian Register) Permit are permitted to compete in the AHA PERFORMANCE CLASSES for HA/AA and Anglo-Arabian horses. Half Arabian and Anglo-Arabian colts & stallions two years & older may compete in Sport Horse In Hand Classes.

HEADGEAR – All juniors riding in Hunter Seat Equitation sections must wear properly fitting protective headgear while riding in the designated schooling & exercise areas the show ring and while jumping anywhere on the competition grounds. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEA) in any division or class without penalty from the judge.

INDEMNITY AND NON-RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSES - All entries are accepted with the understanding that the Rancho California Arabian Horse Association and Galway Downs Equestrian Center not be held responsible for any loss damage or injury to any horse exhibited or any article of any kind. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor who will be responsible for any loss damage or injury to any person animal or property occasioned by him his agents or employees or by an animal owned or exhibited any and shall indemnify the Rancho California Arabian Horse Association and Galway Downs Equestrian Center against any and all loss damages and liability thus occasioned including but not limited to any and all legal costs including attorney fees which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of an entry form to the Show Secretary shall constitute an acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.

JUDGES - If for any reason a judge fails to attend this show or perform his/her duties the Show Committee reserves the right to substitute a judge for the one who is officially designated in the Prize List. It is a violation of USEF Rules to commit any act or make remarks during the show that are considered offensive and/or made with the intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging. No one shall approach a judge with regard to a decision or at any time unless he first obtains permission from the Show Steward who shall arrange an appointment with the judge at a proper time and place.

LOCATION OF CLASSES - Show management reserves the right to hold classes or portions of classes on the grounds outside the Main Arena if it is found necessary to do so or to change and/or modify the Schedule of Events as necessary to accommodate the entries received.

GENERAL INFORMATION

USEF MOTORIZED VEHICLE RULES - Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

RESOLUTION 9-90 FEE - Every horse competing in these shows must pay \$15.00 PER HORSE ONLY ONCE to fund the Education & Evaluation program for A.H.A. judges & stewards.

RULES - This Horse Show is conducted in accordance with the rules of the US Equestrian Federation (National Equestrian Federation of the United States) Chapter AR - Arabian HA/AA and Anglo-Arabian Division. The official Rule Book of US Equestrian will prevail for this show. This Prize List is based on rules of the current Rule Book; any changes or corrections of rules will automatically become a part of the Prize List. Each participant in this show is responsible for knowledge of and is subject to the USEF Rules. **EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT U.S. EQUESTRIAN RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.** The Show Committee shall decide questions not covered by USEF Rules and its decisions will be final.

USEF / DRUG FEE – For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation (USEF) a \$23.00 Federation Fee will be collected per horse (\$15 shall be an Equine Drugs and Medication fee to provide for research inspection and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; see GR407.1.2 and .3) An exhibitor must file an official Equine Drugs and Medications Report Form (in writing) with the Show Steward or Designated Competition Office Representative within one hour after administration or one hour after the Steward or Designated Competition Office Representative returns to duty if administration is at a time other than during competition hours. The official Drugs and Medication Report Form is available from the officiating Show Steward or Designated Competition Office Representative.
